Zoia Skoropadenko Art STATEMENT

Intellectual landscapes series was created on Zoia's endless travels between Monaco, Paris, Japan, California and Britain, blazes a new trail.

Intellectual landscapes depict rural views around her summer studios, seascapes around her hometown Monaco, sketched from high-speed French (TGV, Eurostar) and Japanese(Shinkansen) trains.


Skoropadenko loves trains. On her journeys, she captures landscapes that pass at 320km/h, a blur, a snapshot flashing past her window. Every blink of an eye is a new landscape. Every second a new sketch to be made.

Following the footsteps of Corot, whose paintings Skoropadenko studied and recreated in Musee d'Orsay in Paris as a copyist, her style has evolved towards a kind of minimalism. Cutting details, refining the essence of the landscape, she giving for her audience space for their own inner eye to see and imagine.

Today she uses painterly gestures to depict the lush landscapes of the Dorgogne or Provence. Heavily influenced by Japanese masters like Yuki Ogura and her "Bathing women", Hokusai's landscape and Cezanne's colour pallet, Skoropadenko embraces the Japanese art philosophy of clear vision, clean lines and bold shapes.










TORSO Acrylic on canvas/Mixed technique 180x120cm



Zoia Skoropadenko Studio | BIO

Zoia Skoropadenko is **Monaco** based **contemporary mixed-media artist**. She is the creator and owner of **micro-gallery La Vitrine** - an **alternative contemporary art space** for **emerging artistic talent**.

Born in Ukraine she was tutored by Ukrainian National Artist Grigory Sinitsa. She then entered the National Art School, Art College and studied in Institute of Fine Arts. She continued her education in Lviv National University. After a long adventure "down and out" ended up in Monaco. Skoropadenko found herself working in the art scene and at the same time supporting herself translating for yacht companies and Interpol.

She participated in the artistic life of the French Riviera. Along the way she met such prominent contemporary artists as Arman, Ernst Fuchs, Sosno and Robert Rauschenberg. Became a member of National Art Committee, illustrated a book and exhibited. She worked in the Mosaic Art Studio of Nall Hollis.

In 2011 Skoropadenko curated an exhibition of Ukrainian Impressionists in European Parliament in Strasbourg.

One of her biggest solo controversial exhibitions of TORSO was held in Council of Europe under Ukrainian flag.

In November 2014 her work from series "Green" and "Intellectual landscapes" was auctioned in Los Angeles at the Auction of Michael Hort Foundation on request of renown art collector Stanley Hollander.

In November 2013 Skoropadenko was invited to speak about being a successful female artist immigrant in European Commission in Brussels. In November 2016 Zoia inaugurated her sculpture 'The Hope' in Soma city in Fukushima Prefecture.

In 2011 the Monaco government granted Skoropadenko the official status of a Professional Artist-Painter of Monaco.

Zoia splits her time mainly between Monaco, Japan, the US, Belgium, UK and France where she exhibits frequently.

Her widely exhibited TORSO series is considered her most controversial work as noted in publications such as the Brussels Times and Culture Box.
